Do you have published walk leaflets?	X	<ul> <li>With restrictions coming and going on access to businesses, we have not sought to maintain and refresh the 50+ stickers we had placed in the town. We have purchased new ones (round instead of square logo, and also including our own web address and QR code), but will not seek to place them until 2022.</li> <li>Our original 14 walks remain downloadable from our website, though we no longer have hard copies. These have been supplemented by a booklet of short (mostly 4 miles maximum) walks, funded from the Co-operative Community Fund. These are also on the website, with hard copies also available from the Library, at the Co-op itself and in a few other selected locations.</li> <li>The Co-operative Community Fund also enabled the production of a short leaflet; distribution has been postponed to 2022.</li> <li>We were able to get a piece about DWaW published in the regional newspaper, the EDP. X	We have continued to seek donations for walks, rather than charging for them; sometimes this has brought in very little, at other times more; overall, we believe that total income has been little different.  Interesting to see that getting donations for walks has had little impact on income. I noted the funding from Co-operative Community Fund. Are there any other local funding streams, grants etc that can be tapped in 2022?

X	<ul> <li>As stated in previous years, Dereham is not yet an obvious tourist destination, though we are pleased that some people come on to our walks from well outside the town. Our intention remains to build on a largely local or regional recognition of walking opportunities, and join in with other organisations (mostly under the aboutDereham umbrella) to feature good walking as one among many other attractions of the town.</li> </ul>

			<ul> <li>Our input to the developing Town Plan has included the idea that it would be good for Norfolk if tourist promotion moved away from pushing the north coast (in many people's view already well oversubscribed at peak times), and central Norfolk (Dereham is right in the middle!) and The Brecks are good alternatives.</li> <li>copies of the Short Walks Booklet (see Q5) have been provided to the Social Prescriber Link Worker to pass on to patients as appropriate and for distribution to GP practices in Dereham and surrounding areas.
