	some was discussion regarding the problem of fly tipping on Dereham's public
	rights of way and a short presentation on Walkers are Welcome given, to benefit

7.3	NCC: Some further signage has appeared on new Restricted Byways, but it is patchy. DWaW to check what is still needed.
7.4	BDC: Breckland are still working on the fly tipping just off FP14. There may still be some positive co-operation from Breckland even though it is not their responsibility. The rubbish is now harder to see as it has been covered with overgrowth. Serco have said that they have removed it, but it does not appear to have all gone. The Town Clerk has advised that half the land on which there is tipping may be owned by NCC and half by the church. There is further work to be done on this. One option may be to cease attempting to clear the rubbish, and have a fence put up instead to deter further tipping and mean walkers will no longer be confronted by the sight of the rubbish. Breckland now have an officer dedicated to tackling fly tipping, and prosecutions have already been made. WaW National are planning themed days in 2020, when WaW towns all engage in the same activity with the aim of generating national publicity. The first themed walk will be around clearing litter from the Public Rights Of Way network, and this could be a good opportunity to get Highways England, NCC and Breckland to work together on clearing RB37. DWaW could also hold their annual litter pick to coincide with this themed day.
