4	Publicity		
4.1	Contact list: the list currently stands at 184 emails, plus 3 to phone. It continues to slowly grow, with more people joining than leaving it.		
4.2	Logos: We will approach more businesses about placing our logo in their window, keeping each other informed as to which businesses have been asked so that there is no duplication.		
4.3	aflet: 562 of 10000 distributed.		
4.4	Short walks booklets: The supply has now been exhausted and 5000 of the revised version are now available. Old ones should be used first if possible, such as the ones that Dorothy has.		
	The Social Prescribers need to be reminded to distribute the short walks booklets we have passed to them, and given more if needed.		
4.5	Wayfinding leaflets: 540 of 1000 distributed (Partea Hut, Library, aD and walkers). They will also be distributed to MNR when we visit for our walk on 27 July. We could do a reprint and split the cost with DHT and aD again, although it need not be an equal split, all agreed.		
4.6	New town walk: It is planned to use this as the HODs walk, then review if it warrants publication as a further leaflet. £150 would be a likely cost for 1000. Much of the walk is town based. It was agreed that it would be good to aim for a consistent style in our publications, a different one for town based and footpath walks. There are more information boards going up at the Ellenor Fenn Garden and Gidneys Works, so there may be more content at the reprint stage. It was suggested that rather than have extra pages, we could shrink the map and key columns and have a column on the map page.		
4.7	Social media: Information is passed on and quickly uploaded to Facebook.		
4.8	Media/Publicity: We discussed the possibility of submitting an article on the train walk with a photo to the Dereham Times.		
5	Future work and plans		
5.1	Town walks booklets: no change, update needed. There are still plans to put them into a common format.		
5.2	Library meeting: Talk planned for 24 July.		
5.3	Easy Tuesday Walks: The walk leaders have agreed that they will continue to run the Easy Tuesday Walks, although there may have to be a break over winter when walking conditions may not be so good. Keeping the walks to two miles and keeping to flat terrain can be quite tricky, but the walk format is working well with regular attendees. Some of the walks would be suitable for a mobility scooter, and this may be specifically advertised next year.

7 Footpath issues

- 7.1 <u>Footpath work</u>. (map circulated with agenda) See issues raised with DTC and this update
 - 1 FP2, RB3: no action, still pressing NCC. DTC is sending a solicitor's letter to NCC. It is hoped that this will be enough to generate some action.
 - Litter at FP13/14: still chasing the Diocese, no response so far. The litter is unsightly and unpleasant. It has previously been cleared up, but unless a fence is built, the rubbish will always collect again.
 - 3 FP14: fallen tree believed to still require clearance
 - 4 FP14a: no change, the boardwalk still needs renewing.
 - RB32: surfacing work: no change, either to surface of existing improved path or to extending further to The Neatherd. Potential encroachment at the eastern end will require monitoring after wet weather.
 - RB36, RB37 are much improved and now open. The plan had been to clear the vegetation, then tackle the litter, then fence the area off. DWaW to pursue as the litter is still there.
 - 7 Hurn Road path: ongoing, DWaW have submitted an enforcement complaint to BDC. A member of the public raised a complaint with DTC about overgrowth on this path, which ultimately led to the involvement of a interested councillor.

7.2	 Dereham Town Council Report: The report submitted to the Town Council's Heritage and Open Spaces Committee meeting for 27 June 2023 was circulated prior to the meeting. Future meeting dates have (again) been changed, now to 26 Sep, 28 Nov 23, 27 Feb, 23 Apr and 25 Jun 24. Toilets: DTC had agreed the implementation of a Community Toilet Scheme in Dereham, whereby participating businesses allow the public to access their toilet facilities. The idea was modelled on a similar scheme in Kendal. 	
7.3	The scheme has been budgeted but no action taken yet, having never made it to the top of DTC's priority list. It was agreed that DWaW would make a representation to DTC about the need to have a greater range of toilet facilities to direct groups of walkers to (rather than criticising the state of the current toilet provision in Barwell Court). BDC: Nothing to report
