1	Minutes and matters arising from the meeting on 20 November 2023
1.1	Minutes have been circulated and an edited version for the website has been uploaded.
1.2	 Matters arising not elsewhere on the agenda: 1.2 Community Toilet Scheme – this is not currently being pursued with DTC. 2.3 Programme Leaflet – this has been produced and handed out to walk participants, who have welcomed it. There may be changes to the programme which means the leaflet becomes out of date, but this is unavoidable. A recent updated version has been circulated.
2	Website and IT
2.1	Work continues on the website.
2.2	We will progress the setting up of a dedicated DWaW email address, to enable emails to be sent out to our contact list in one batch rather than several batches, which can be time consuming.
3	Finance update
3.1	The end of year accounts were presented to the Annual Public Meeting on 20 April. We have gained £70 during the year, and the grant from DTC has not all been spent despite a substantial spend on printing. We have £587.74 uncommitted funds, as well as our reserve of £400.
3.2	It was agreed that it would be good to spend the money we are holding on behalf of the former Dereham Society. A bench on the Neatherd was suggested, with an inscription on where the money has come from.
3.3	Barclays was closed and the money moved to Lloyds on 20 March.
3.4	Update and regular outgoings

4 Publicity

- 4.1 <u>Contact list</u>: the list currently stands at 197 emails, plus 3 to phone.
- 4.2 <u>Logos</u>: Topping up and checking that logos are still in place to recommence shortly.
- 4.3 Publications: Leaflets (9000) are being distributed as opportunity arises. We will continue to take them to Yaxham Waters although they are not in such a good position in the café as before. The short walks booklets (5000), Town Trail leaflets (1000) and Circular walks leaflets (3000) are also being distributed when possible and being topped up regularly in the library. It was agreed that we will take them to Dereham Day at the Memorial Hall on May 11th.

4.4 Social Media:

The following procedures to deal with Facebook queries have been proposed and it was agreed to keep them in case of future need:

- anything posted that is a question about whether a particular walk would be suitable for a particular circumstance should be met with a response to say we'll check and reply as soon as we can, and the question emailed on to us.
- ideally a contact for the enquirer will be available, either email or phone number, as that will allow for a conversation if needed.
- We will advise our Facebook administrator on how to respond to the query via Facebook, offering further contact (email/phone) where necessary, and with copies so that the walk leader is informed.
- we should avoid anything that assures an enquirer that everything will be fine – we can only describe the situation and then let people make a judgement in light of the information we provide.

5 Future work and plans

A Dereham Plan for Dereham Residents: DWaW have, as part of aboutDereham, been attending the meetings called by our MP and Rector.

The first meeting was held before Christmas in St Nicholas Church on the 'let's get Dereham moving' agenda. There was a second meeting held in February via Zoom, and a third in person meeting on April 26th.

It is taking some time to get things going and establish priorities. There is community sector, business sector, County Council (councillor and staff), District Councillor, Breckland Council staff and Town Council presence (DTC councillors attending on a personal basis rather than representing the town Council). The business sector are owners of premises in the Market Place who are keen to be taking some action. Our MP has been attending the meetings and doing a good job of facilitating the process.

There are no implications for DWaW yet, apart from the consensus around the aim of attracting more people to the town and providing a good experience for visitors.

7	Footpath issues			
7.1	 Footpath work: See also issues raised with DTC (7.2.1) 1 FP2: NCC taken some steps towards establishing the field edge path on the correct alignment. 2 RB3: NCC is planning to install a culvert to cross the ditch. 3 FP12/12a: A Town Councillor has pressed National Highways to resolve the issue of flooding under the bypass. Action apparently agreed. 4 FP13/14: still chasing the Diocese re the litter; the Rector has also been involved 5 FP14: trees blocking the path have been removed with permission from the school. There is now a damaged fence which is blocking the footpath. 6 FP14a: no change - boardwalk is in disrepair 7 FP25: has again suffered from flooding at the south end; it has been reported 8 FP26: remains difficult after wet weather; approaches to press for help from private users whose vehicles impede the public's ability to walk have foundered 9 RB28,30,31: require clearance a few times during the year; RB31 was also a stream after wet weather. 10 RB32: encroachment at the eastern end did not seem to create problems after wet weather; DTC has put in a Parish Path Partnership bid to surface the western section (though only to its end, not on to The Neatherd) 11 FP34: awaiting NCC ability to deal with wet/muddy conditions and possibly add the woodland section to the cutting contract 12 RB36 (Cherry Lane): the section from Norwich Road to the Windmill is once again badly potholed, but action is limited as with FP26 13 RB37: National Highways has now apparently stated that the fence behind the layby is not its responsibility but that of the landowner, who is unidentified. In spite of BDC saying that it would not instal a

7.3	Breckland Byways: Contact has been made by this body which seeks to look at possible claims to add paths to the Definitive Map, create new paths where short links would connect existing paths and influence the planning system better to integrate existing routes into developments to encourage active travel. DWaW have responded but not heard from them since.
