7 Footpath issues

7.1 Footpath work - see also the latest report to DTC HOSC

- FP1a: blocked by 20m of scrub and a dense crop of maize; supposed to be being reported by councillors as part of a DTC agreement, but nothing has been heard yet..
- 2 FP2: the field edge path on the correct alignment is signed, but the path remained overgrown at the last visit (no change).
- RB3: An indirect (but broadly acceptable) path had been cut through the crop, following tractor tracks to a substantial extent.
- 4 FP13/14: no response ever received from the Diocese, but litter less in evidence so not pursued recently.
- 5 FP14: overgrown and needing attention.
- 6 FP14a: boardwalk is in disrepair, but we have been informed by The Town Clerk that Norfolk Trails plans to replace the boardwalk this autumn.
