


What can you see in Dereham town centre? Follow the route (the red line on the map) and see if you can find all of the things shown in these photos. You may want to have a pencil to write down your answers to the questions. There are also 12 questions to research - you may find some of the answers as you look, but others may need to be investigated back at home. If you're really stuck, all of the answers are on the back page.

Everything can be seen from pavements and public areas, but you will need to cross the road sometimes, so please check carefully for traffic before you do so.



Directions

If you follow the route shown by the red line on the map, you will pass all of the things shown in the photos - but you may have to look very carefully!

Start at the bus stops in the Market Place (across the road from the market and parking area). Walk towards the war memorial, but stay on the pavement to the second set of traffic light controlled crossings. Cross the road, turn right and carefully cross Theatre Street into Wellington Road to look around here.

Return to the Market Place and cross the road by the two part traffic light controlled crossing. Once across, turn a little to the left to the top of Rüthen Place and look around there.

Staying on the same side of the road, turn and go towards the war memorial and on to The George, then turn round from The George to enter Quebec Street by the Post Office.

Continue along Quebec Street to the end and turn right down Church Street. At the bottom, turn left to pass in front of Bishop Bonner's Cottage Museum, then go round behind the Museum to return to Church Street and walk up on the right hand side.

At the top, cross High Street and turn right, away from the Market Place. Go along High Street to pass The Bull, then cross High Street and return to the Market Place. Cross Church Street to enter the left side of the Market Place (by the bus stop). Check what you can see from both sides of the road through the Market Place, ending at your start point.



- It's Hill House (NR19) on Wellington Road, close to Theatre Street
- No left turn. The downpipe can be seen from Rüthen Place it's opposite the side of the Assembly Rooms Þ
- Sowerbys, in the Market Place near Swaffham Hill and Quebec Road 9

- It leads to York Place. Page's (or Pages) Yard is on the right of Quebec Street as you walk away from the Post Office 8
